3: Completing education of cohort iv

The education portion of cohort iv finished earlier this month. Since June, the cohort has participated in <u>over 40 sessions</u> on different topics of nonprofit management including strategy, leadership, marketing, operations, fundraising, and more. 4: Sharing cohort iv successes

"Since joining the Accelerator, Foundations Curriculum has branched out in new directions that we never anticipated. We just completed an 11 session Zoom Teacher Training with teachers in Ramat Bet Shemesh, Israel. The curriculum is in the process of being translated into Hebrew for use with Israeli students. Israel is also using our English version to help acclimate new Olot.

5: Spotlighting our alumni


Wondering what our alumni are up to?
